By 6:00pm each day, the following day's schedule with class counts and start / finish times will be available outside of the show office and online at the horseshowing.com website. You can also view results from previous day's classes. So be sure to visit the official information site for all CEP Shows, www.horseshowing.com!

EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS



USEF requirements, combined with management and facility policies, are designed to protect your horse and other horses participating in any show at Westworld. These measures are designed to decrease the risk of introduction or spread of contagious or infectious disease.

Horses may only arrive during the hours published in this prize list. Arrivals at any other time must be approved in advance by emailing CEP at cepshows@aol.com at least 72 hours prior to arrival.

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Arrival paperwork is currently not required. However, upon your arrival, you attest that all horses on your trailer have been healthy with no sign of infectious disease and have not had a temperature above 101.5°F within 72 hours of arrival, nor have been around any horses or at any barn or facility that had any horses that were sick or under any type of quarantine within 30 days of arrival. This is required for all horses entering the show grounds whether showing or not. Management reserves the right to amend these requirements and/or require physical paperwork in the event of any equine health issues that may arise before or during the shows. In addition, the following requirements of the USEF, facility and state of Arizona must also be followed:

PROOF OF VACCINATION (required by USEF)

Attests to the fact that you are in possession of (and must be shown upon request) a signed statement or vaccination record from a veterinarian that the horse(s) have been vaccinated against:

Equine Influenza (EIV) within 6 months of the first show day

Rhinopneumonitis (EHV 1 and EHV 4) within 6 months of the first show day

If a vaccination will expire during one of the shows, the horse must receive its new vaccination prior to being issued a competition number for the next show.

NEGATIVE COGGINS & HEALTH CERTIFICATE (required by Westworld and the State of Arizona)

Attests to the fact that all horses arriving at the show must have (and must be shown upon request):

Negative Coggins for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) dated within 12 months of the first show day

In addition, horses coming from out-of-state must have (and must be shown upon request):

A Health Certificate dated within 30 (thirty) days of the first show day

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The above requirements may be amended at any time by show management if any outbreaks, diseases or other equine health issues arise before the start of the show. CEP Affordable Stall Options

Starting in 2026, CEP is proud to offer affordable stall options that allow trainers and exhibitors to use stalls more closely aligned with their show needs. Choices are:

Weekly Stall

For those of you needing a stall for the full week of a show, you can reserve a “Weekly Stall”. You can arrive on move-in day and leave on the last day of the show or, if you’re from out-of-state, you can leave the following morning. For a three-day show, this means you can move-in on Wednesday and leave on Sunday or Monday. For a four-day show, you can move-in on Tuesday and leave on Sunday or Monday. For a five-day show, you can move-in on Monday and leave on Sunday or Monday.

Open Stall

If you just want to show in the open / professional classes on the first day or two of a show, you can reserve an “Open Stall”. You can move-in the day before your classes start, show in your classes, then leave after your classes end. For a three-day show, this means you can move-in on Thursday, show on Friday and leave Friday afternoon. For a four-day show, you can move-in on Wednesday, show Thursday and Friday and leave Friday afternoon. For a five-day show, you can move-in on Tuesday, show Wednesday and Thursday and leave Thursday afternoon.

Weekend Stall

If you just want to show in classes over the weekend, regardless of how long the show is, you can reserve a “Weekend Stall”. This means you can move-in on Friday, show on Friday, Saturday and/or Sunday and leave Sunday afternoon.

Please keep in mind that, in order to take advantage of these special stall rates, you must follow the arrival and departure days as listed. If you reserve an “Open” or “Weekend” stall, and you wind up moving in earlier or staying later for any reason, your stall will revert to a full “Weekly” stall rate. Sorry, but no prorated stalls allowed. If you wish, you may simply “Haul-In” daily for one flat Haul-In Fee.

And remember, you must choose a stall option when entering online so we know what you need, but you do not have to pay for it in advance. Your stall will be added to your account for payment upon closeout. CEP hopes this will help to make your showing options more accessible up front and more affordable in the end.

What Is USHJA “Outreach”

In this Q & A, CEP explains exactly what the USHJA Outreach Program is and how it can save you a lot of money when showing

Q: *What is Outreach?*

A: Outreach is a program hosted by the USHJA (United States Hunter Jumper Association) that allows horse shows to offer classes that don't have the same amount of requirements and regulations as the USEF classes that are usually found at a rated horse show.

Q: *What are some of the USEF requirements that Outreach does not require?*

A: Horses and riders that show only in Outreach classes at rated shows don't have to pay the \$25 USEF Fee, don't have to be a USEF or USHJA member, don't have to pay for a non-member or show pass fee and horses do not have to be microchipped. Only if you want to accrue points towards USHJA year-end awards would the rider need to be a USHJA Outreach-level member (Free) and the horse would need to be recorded with the USHJA (\$20 annual or \$75 lifetime).

Q: *I know that getting points in USEF rated classes count for USEF National and Zone awards. Does earning points in Outreach classes get any points towards any year-end awards programs and finals?*

A: Yes. There are Outreach High Point Awards offered in each zone, you can qualify for an Outreach Festival Championship held in most zones, and you can qualify for a “Golden Backstage Pass” and Affiliate Finals classes at the USHJA National Championship in Las Vegas. You also get full points towards AHJA Category 2 year-end awards and qualifying for the AHJA Mini Medal 2'6” Final.

Q: *I was once told that Outreach classes are like being at a backyard schooling show. Is this true?*

A: No. The Outreach classes held at CEP horse shows consist of most of the classes that are not USEF rated. Instead of offering them under USEF rules and regulations with all of the requirements and higher costs, they are offered under the USHJA Outreach program which allows them to be separate and have different rules from USEF classes. In other words, if you want to compete at a USEF rated horse show, but don't want to show in any of the USEF rated classes or you just want to spend a lot less money, you can enter and show in Outreach classes.



Q: *Are the quality of the jumps, judging, courses, etc. lower than in USEF rated classes?*

A: No. Both USEF and Outreach classes are held at the same shows, in the same rings, with the same jumps and courses and in front of the same judges.

Q: *Can you enter and show in both Outreach and USEF rated classes at the same show?*

A: Yes, but then you are required to adhere to all USEF rules, requirements and fees.

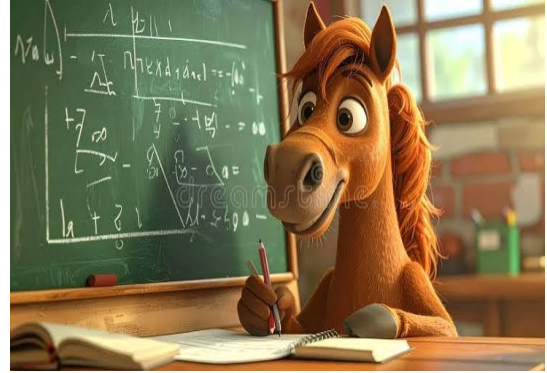
Q: *How will I know what classes are USEF rated and what classes are Outreach?*

A: On the class listing pages in the prize list, all Outreach classes are listed on one page per show that is titled “USHJA Outreach (OR) Sections & Classes”. On the schedules, Outreach classes have the letters “OR” in front of every class name.

Q: *Is there a difference in entry fees between USEF rated classes and Outreach classes?*

A: Yes. At CEP shows, entry fees for most Outreach classes average \$25 to \$35 while USEF rated classes average \$35 to \$55+ depending upon rating and prize money. Most other USEF rated shows around the country don't give much, if any, discount for Outreach classes ... CEP does. Be sure to choose CEP shows to take advantage of the affordable entry fees for Outreach classes.

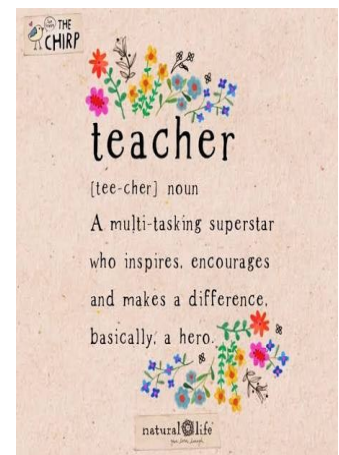

### **SCHOOLING IN THE SHOW RINGS**

**NEW POLICY:** All horses schooling in the show rings at any time, including on warm-up days, **MUST** be entered in the show, have a signed entry blank on file in the office and wear your competition number.

**WARM-UP DAYS (Free Schooling):** Jumper Ring open for schooling from 10am to 4pm. Hunter Ring(s) are open for schooling from 10am to 5pm. No set schedules and you may adjust fence heights as needed.

**SHOW DAYS (Ticketed Schooling):** On show mornings, rings are open for hacking only, no jumping, unless otherwise stated on the daily schedule. Anyone observed jumping may be eliminated from classes in that ring on that day without refund. On show afternoons, rings may be open for schooling after classes are done and the course is rebuilt, time and weather permitting. To school, you must present a schooling ticket, available in the office, or have one charged to your account. In any case, no schooling will be allowed after 5pm.

#### **Entry closing date is Monday, October 5th, 2026.**

Online entries must be submitted by this date to be considered on time. Entries submitted after this date or submitted without the Registration Fee are considered late / incomplete and will incur a \$50 Late Fee at the show.

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- 1) Go to www.horseshowing.com and follow the links to Enter Shows / Click Here To Enter Online
- 2) Log in (or create account if this is your first time)
- 3) Complete entry / class information as required
- 4) For stall reservation, choose one of the following:

SCOTTSDALE FALL CLASSIC 1

- a) If stabling the entire week (Wed thru Sun) select Weekly Stall
- b) If arriving Thursday, showing Friday only, then leaving Friday afternoon, select Open Stall
- c) If arriving Friday, showing Saturday and/or Sunday, leaving Sunday afternoon, select Weekend Stall

SCOTTSDALE FALL CLASSIC 2

- a) If stabling the entire week (Mon thru Sun) select Weekly Stall
- b) If arriving Tuesday, showing Wednesday and Thursday only, then leaving Thursday afternoon, select Open Stall
- c) If arriving Friday, showing Friday, Saturday and/or Sunday, leaving Sunday afternoon, select Weekend Stall

EITHER WEEK

- a) If you are planning to haul-in, select Haul-In Fee
 - b) Be sure to choose one of the stabling options so the show knows what you need. You **DO NOT** need to pay for your stall in advance. The Stall Fee will be charged upon closeout.
 - c) You must adhere to the move-in and move-out days to take advantage of the discounted stall rates. If you arrive earlier or depart later, then you will be charged for the full Weekly Stall
- 5) Be sure to sign all applicable fields on both the Entry Blank and the USEF Waiver
 - 6) The \$100 Registration Fee must accompany your entry and may be done in one of two ways:
 - a) If you wish to pay by credit card, click on the "Credit Card" option, complete the information and submit your entry. This transaction will be charged immediately upon submission. A non-refundable 3% Convenience Fee will be added to all credit card transactions. If you wish to have your final bill upon closeout charged to this same card, check the "Save Card" option before submitting.
 - b) If you wish to pay by check, click on the "Check" option before submitting your entry. Then mail a check, payable to CEP, 29455 N Cave Creek Road, Suite 118-430, Cave Creek, AZ 85331. Be sure to write the horse's show name on the memo line. This check must be received by the entry closing date. Checks received **AFTER** entry closing date or not received at all will result in a \$50 Late Fee.
 - 7) If you pay with credit card, and checked the "Save Card" option, your card will be charged when closing out at the end of the show. If you pay with credit card and do not check the "Save Card" option or you pay by check, you will be required to provide credit card information or leave a signed, blank check with the office upon check-in. Otherwise, your account will be charged to the Trainer of record upon closeout.

Draw For Order Of Go: The draw for the first round order of go will take place on Saturday morning at the horse show office. The time will be announced. Second round order will be low score to high score from the first round.

Format: The first round of all finals will take place on Saturday afternoon / evening. The top twelve will return for a second round on Sunday morning. Tied riders in the 12th position shall all return. Riders eliminated in the first round may not return for the second round under any circumstances. After the second round is completed and scores are totaled from both rounds, further testing is only required for competitors that are within 4 points of the leader. Further testing for those outside of the four point margin is at the discretion of the judge. In any case, no more than four riders in each final will be asked to test further.

All disputes or changes will be settled or determined by the AHJA Board of Directors before the Finals commence. If you are a finalist, it is important to refer to the AHJA website for any recent updates or changes to any specifications.

HUNTER CHAMPIONSHIPS: The titles shall be awarded to two of the four horses which have acquired the most points over fences. In addition to these points, only these four horses shall receive full points for ribbons won in Under Saddle classes and Model classes. Ties in Hunter Championships shall be broken as specified in the USEF Rule Book. All others will remain tied and shall receive equal awards. Points Calculated: 10, 6, 4, 2, 1, 1/2.

JUMPER CHAMPIONSHIPS: Points for all classes shall be calculated 10, 6, 4, 2, 1, 1/2. In case of a tie for champion or reserve, the tied entries shall remain tied and each receive a ribbon, if available, and flip a coin for the trophy / prize. In the OR Crossrail, Mini and Puddle Jumpers, Table II Clear Round classes will award five (5) points for a clear round on each respective championship chart. Optimum Time classes will be pinned and pointed as usual.

EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS: Points for all classes shall be calculated 10, 6, 4, 2, 1, 1/2 and all classes to count equally. In case of a tie for champion or reserve, the winner shall be: 1) the entry with the most points over fences; if still tied: 2) the entry with the most points in the equitation flat class.

General Rules & Regulations

REGISTRATION FEE: Every horse must pay a \$100 Registration Fee when submitting entries. This fee includes office fees, processing and costs, online access fees, medical coverage and facility access.

STABLING: Stalls are permanent, 10'x12' with full doors and rubber mats. See Stall Fees under each horse show listing for prices and terms. Day Stalls and pro-rated stalls are not available. Stalls are non-transferable and may not be shared or resold.

SHAVINGS: Contract requirements supersede USEF GR1216.7. Competitors are prohibited from bringing their own shavings or having such delivered onto any of the show grounds for any use. Shavings must be purchased through the facility concession on the grounds. Violations may result in fines up to \$250 or more.

GROUND'S FEE: A one-time Ground's Fee of \$25 will be charged for horses that are showing and have not purchased a stall. This allows a horse to haul-in, tie to a trailer and show. Horses claiming a Ground's Fee but using a stall, even briefly, will be charged a stall fee.

ADDING REGULAR CLASSES: If you wish to add a regular class after initially checking in and picking up your number, you must do so by 5pm or close of office, whichever comes first, the day before the class is to be held. Adds after this time or same day adds will only be allowed if the schedule in that ring is not full. The yellow copy of the Add / Scratch Form **MUST** be given to the starter **BEFORE** the start of the class that was added. There is no charge to add a regular class. Should a starter close you out of a class that you added, but you failed to deliver the add sheet prior to the start of the class, you will forfeit the entry fee.

SCRATCHING REGULAR CLASSES: If you do not intend to show in a regular class you have entered, you **MUST** scratch it on an Add / Scratch Form or Trainer Form in the horse show office by 5pm or close of office, whichever comes first, the day before the class is held. There will be no charge for this. Scratches after this time or same day scratches will be charged a \$10 per class fee and must be done in the horse show office **BEFORE** the start of the class. Scratches may not be done after a class has started. Scratching at the back gate or simply not showing up for your class will result in forfeiture of the entry fee.

ADDING / SCRATCHING CLASSICS & SPECIAL CLASSES: Adds and scratches should be made by 5pm or close of office, whichever comes first, the day before the class is held. Adds after this time, if accepted, will pay a Post Entry Fee and must go first in the order. Scratches from these classes must be done in the horse show office by 5pm or close of office, whichever comes first, the day before the class is held. Scratches after this time or same day scratches will forfeit the entry fee unless due to an injury to horse or rider and a vet certificate (from the official horse show veterinarian only) or medical release form (from the official horse show medical personnel only) is presented to the office at the time of the scratch. See specific exceptions on Special Classes pages.

EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: See the full page in this prize list for Equine Health Requirements to attend the show.

SHOW SCRATCH (a horse entered but scratched from the entire show prior to going in any classes): On or before the closing date of entries: If you entered via credit card, it will be refunded (except for the Convenience Fee, which is fully non-refundable); If you sent in a check, it will be shredded (checks are not deposited until the entry closing date). **After the closing date of entries, the \$100 Registration Fee is not refundable under any circumstances and is forfeited as a Show Scratch Fee.** Any other fees paid in advance, including the Stall Fee (as long as the horse didn't use a stall), are fully refundable (except for the Convenience Fee, which is fully non-refundable). Show scratches in which the horse doesn't come to the show must be done by the start of the show. Show scratches after the start of the show must be requested before the end of the show. No show scratch refund requests will be processed after the show is over.

EQUITATION ENTRIES: Equitation riders must wear the number of the horse they are entered on. Numbers are assigned to horses, not riders. If a rider wishes to change horses for an equitation class, they may do so without penalty; however, the proper paperwork must be completed in the show office prior to the start of the class. Exhibitors changing horses without notifying the office will forfeit their entry fee on the original horse and be charged the entry fee plus an RDNE Fee on the new horse.

SUBSTITUTIONS: With a vet's certificate, a new horse may be substituted for a show scratched horse as long as the scratched horse has not shown in any classes and both horses are registered under the same trainer. The scratched horse's Registration Fee and Stall Fee are transferred to the substituted horse with no penalty or charge.

RETURNED CHECKS: Checks returned by the bank for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense. A 10% PENALTY WILL BE ASSESSED FOR EVERY RETURNED CHECK (MINIMUM OF \$50.00)! Accounts will be given seven (7) days to be paid in full with cash or credit card or they will be turned into the USEF for disciplinary action.

RDNE (Rode Did Not Enter): Entries that show in a class not properly entered will be charged the class entry fee plus a \$25 RDNE Fee. Starters are not responsible for keeping you out of classes that you are not officially entered in. If you 'crash' the gate and go into a class you are not entered in in a ring that is closed to same day adds, you will be charged the class entry fee plus a \$50 RDNE Fee.

CREDIT CARD TRANSACTIONS: Visa, Mastercard and Discover can be used for payment of your Registration Fee when entering and your final bill when closing out in the horse show office. All retail credit card transactions will incur a 3% Convenience Fee. Sorry, but American Express is not accepted. Convenience Fees are paid to the merchant account and are non-refundable under any circumstances.

PRIZEMONEY / AWARDS: Prize money checks will be mailed to the owner or listed payee within 30 days after the conclusion of the show. Social Security number of OWNER or PAYEE is required before any prize money will be paid. All purses and add-backs shall be divided as follows unless otherwise specified: 1st - 30%, 2nd - 22%, 3rd - 15%, 4th - 12%, 5th - 11% and 6th - 10%. Ribbons shall be awarded to eighth place in all regular classes and classics unless otherwise stated.

General Rules & Regulations

MONEY / STAKE CLASS ELIGIBILITY: To be eligible for a money, stake and/or jackpot class, entry must have entered and shown in at least one other class in the same section at the show, unless otherwise stated.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

DOGS: USEF GR1301.6 Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule will be issued a Yellow warning card and may be subject to penalty under Chapter 7. Repeated issues could result in Maricopa County Animal Control being called as well as USEF charges being filed.

PARKING: The parking of vehicles and horse trailers is not permitted in the barn areas. Illegal parking anywhere will result in a fine of \$50 per occurrence. This fine will be placed on your horse show account and becomes a part of your financial obligation to the show. Further fines, ticketing and/or towing will result for multiple offenders. Trainers may be held accountable for any parking fines incurred by their staff.

MEDICAL WASTE / SHARPS CONTAINERS: Sharps must be placed in the proper receptacles located in every barn. Violations shall be subject to a \$50 fine per occurrence.

DAMAGE / HOLES IN STALLS & BARN WALLS: Exhibitors will be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees, and will be billed accordingly. Holes punched in any stall or barn wall, or any use of an existing hole, will result in a fine of \$25 per hole punched or used, regardless of who made the hole. Facility staff inspect stalls daily and will charge the horse show for any violations

CONFLICTS: Management cannot allow conflicts to hold up any rings. Riders with potential conflicts must arrange their jumping order with the starters so that they will not hold up a class. Trainer conflicts cannot be recognized. If you are a trainer, be sure to bring enough help to get your horses and clients to the rings in a timely manner or only bring a manageable number of horses if you are limited in the help you have.

TRAINER SPLITS: These shows offer a service that allows trainers to have their tack stalls split evenly amongst their client's horse show bills by completing a Trainer Split Form. See the office for deadlines for submitting this form. Uncollected splits will revert back to the trainer.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: USEF GR801 It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper, or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. A Show Committee, Competition Management, and Licensed Officials must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required.

JOGGING: USEF HU118.3 Option A - Horses / ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses / ponies may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion.

USEF RULE GR901.11: The horse show policies stated herein regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of USEF Rule GR901.11.

ARENAS: Jumper and Hunter 1 are 150'x260'; Hunter 2 is 150'x240'. Jumper and Hunter 1 warm-Ups are 90'x200' each. Hunter 2 warm-up is 160'x160' All footing is a sand / dirt / clay mix.

SAFE SPORT STATEMENT: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

GOLF CARTS: The golf cart rental company used by the show does not rent to individual exhibitors. Therefore, if you need a golf cart, please let us know not later than the entry closing date and we will order one for you and place it on your horse show account. You may specify two passenger or four passenger, but there are no guarantees as we get what is available. Prices will be at current market rates (to be determined by the company). Once delivered, golf carts may not be canceled. You are welcome to find another rental company and order carts directly from them if you wish.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable-casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber and competing only in classes that are exempt from membership requirements, I acknowledge and agree that I will be enrolled at no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew unless and until USEF determines in its sole discretion to terminate my Fan account. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

STATEMENT AS TO FEDERATION FEE (GR208.1)

For every horse participating in any competition licensed by the Federation, a Federation Fee will be collected (a portion of the fee shall be an Equine Drugs and Medication fee to provide for research, inspection, and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs; see GR407.1, .2 and .3). Exception: Horses entered in classes exempted from the Equine Drugs and Medication fee are also exempt from the balance of the Federation fee.
